Executive Director's Report

We continued to strengthen our council during 2012. We had another fantastic year at Camp Tannadoonah, and worked to further develop the Club program.

We have put a lot of emphasis on improving the facilities at Camp Tannadoonah. During 2012 we installed two permanent basketball hoops, built a picket fence along the dining hall lawn, and installed all new ladders for the waterfront pier. We also

sealed the shower house floor, and added tile along the bottom of wall in the shower areas. We painted the shower house with colorful camper handprints. New fans and light fixtures were installed in the Birds cabins.

Austin Raffelock, a former camper and Eagle Scout candidate, built new bunk beds for the Wallace and Exchange cabins. We also started a camp garden to supply fresh food for the kitchen. Unfortunately, a tree fell on the waterfront stairs at the end of the summer. We plan to completely rebuild the iconic waterfront stairs in the coming year.

Our Club program grew slightly this year, increasing from six to seven active clubs, including two new staff-led clubs at Battell Center. We increased from 40 youth to 57 youth in our Club groups. We held many fun Club events this year, including the annual Fun Run and Fun Fair, spring and fall camping weekends, outdoor training, service days, a Sweetheart's Dance, a Harvest Party, and a Craft Workshop.



The summer brought us record high temperatures along with record high numbers of campers at Camp Tannadoonah. We finished the year with 706 total campers for the summer. We were able provide over \$22,000 in campership funds, distributed among 102 campers.

In July, the council held its 4th annual Hog Roast at Camp Tannadoonah. We honored three new Legend Tree nominees for their contributions to the council over the years. The 2012 honorees were Mrs. Jo Murphy, Camp Tannadoonah Director from 1971 to 1997; Mrs. Pat Laing, former Assistant Camp Director and Camp Fire Executive Director; and Ms. Jane "Toody" Goldsberry, former camper, counselor, Camp Director, and longtime council volunteer.

In the fall we held our third Silent Auction in conjunction with the Birch Lake Yacht Club Fall Dinner. The 2012 event included many wonderful items donated by individuals and businesses, and raised over \$7,600 for the council. We ended the year in a strong financial position, with a balanced budget and a positive net income for the third year in a row! We are looking forward to another successful year in 2013.

Director's Note

Camp 2012 was one very hot summer! We added some brand new program options this year, including Japanese, Spanish, lacrosse, archaeology, and advanced sailing. We added an 8th week of camp, and once again increased our camper numbers, with a total of 706 campers this summer. We provided 102 full or partial camperships, and had a 57% camper retention rate from 2011.

The Club group program brings families and communities together in youth development, service projects and fun family events. Clubs meet monthly or bi-monthly with their volunteer leaders, as well as doing service projects and monthly activities arranged by the council.

Director's Note

Our Camp Fire Club program grew this year to seven active groups. We had 57 youth in Club this year, from 14 different area schools, plus some home schooled youth.

I am very pleased with the Battell Center for letting us come in twice a month to run two Club groups. We have



18 youth from seven schools between the two groups. I look forward to working with The Res in Mishawaka in the fall to get a group started there. I am hopeful that the new Club brochures will help bring in more interest in the Club program in the upcoming year.

Thoughout the year, Club youth, leaders, and families participated in monthly activities, including a Sweetheart's dance, Fun Fair, Spring and Fall Group Camping at Tannadoonah, a Harvest Party, Craft Workshop, Bowling, a Hat Workshop, outdoor training, and the Rum Village Hike.

I am always very proud of the excitement and hard work the Club youth show when giving service for our community and the council.
