

HEAD OF CITY RECREATION DEPARTMENT HERE QUILTS

COL. C. SEYMOUR BULLOCK TAKES NEW POSITION.

HAS SERVED FIVE YEARS

School Board in Special Meeting To-day Accepts Decision—Will Become Assistant Secretary of International Rotary.

Col. C. Seymour Bullock, for five years director of municipal recreation in South Bend, tendered his resignation to-day at noon at a special meeting of the school board in the Hotel LaSalle to take effect April 1.

The board accepted the resignation and the board of park commissioners will meet Friday afternoon to take action.

Mr. Bullock has accepted a post-

tion with the International Rotary in Chicago as assistant secretary in charge of the boys' work and community activities departments.

He announced that he will continue to keep his home in South Bend, and retain his interests as commander of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War, and in the Rotary club here.

The work which Mr. Bullock will assume in Chicago will be along the same lines as that in South Bend, namely, the promotion of recreation activities among the children, particularly those crippled and handicapped in any way.

No Successor Named.

Col. Bullock, in presenting his resignation, declared that he is severing his relations here not without some regret, in spite of the fact that a larger field with increased remuneration had opened for him. He came to South Bend immediately after the war in which he served as commander of a Canadian battalion. One of the important phases of activities here has been in connection with the Americanization work carried on through the public schools.

No successor to Mr. Bullock has yet been named, school officials announced to-day.

The school board, at its meeting to-day, also considered the tentative plans of the architects for the Division street school and the Washington school addition, which will be made into a Junior High school, with a machine room to take care of the students in the Oliver school. The Division school will be an elementary school and will be built on the new site recently purchased by the school city between the New York Central and Grand Trunk railways.
