

PLAN CAMP FIRE GIRLS' PROGRAM

Chicago Council Secretary
to be Main Speaker at
Affair Friday.

Final plans have been completed for the program to be presented Friday night at the annual meeting of the South Bend Camp Fire Girls' council by Mrs. J. Albert Harris, who is in charge of arrangements. The principal speaker of the evening will be Mrs. William T. Grable, executive secretary of the Chicago council of Camp Fire Girls and one of the outstanding Camp Fire leaders in the country.

Mrs. Grable was one of the first to take up the work of Camp Fire at the beginning of the organization 17 years ago. When she became secretary of the Chicago council in 1923 the organization had an enrollment of 1,500 girls and during her administration the membership has been increased to over 6,000. Mrs. Grable also conducts a large summer camp for Camp Fire Girls at South Haven, Mich., and since taking over the camp the average weekly registration has grown from 80 to 225. It is felt that Mrs. Grable's address before the local council will be an inspiration to the Camp Fire workers in this city.

George Robertson to Speak.

George A. Robertson, a member of the council, will give a short talk and the annual report will be read by Miss Tyra Christensen, executive secretary.

A special musical program will be furnished by members of the Olive Maize School of Opera who will reenact parts of two operas which have been produced by the school this season. The selections will be given in costume and dramatized. The music will be presented in three groups the first of which will be taken from "In a Persian Garden," by Lisa Layman. The first number of this group, "A Book of Verses," will be sung by Mrs. Anne Christman Waechter and LeRoy Madary. "Ah Moon of My Delight," will follow by Howard Ullery.

Program is Prepared.

The second group will consist of contralto selections by Mrs. Waechter, and the third will be the presentation of two scenes from "Il Trovatore," by Verdi. The first scene of the second act will be sung by Miss Geraldine McPheeters, Mrs. Lillian Klausmeyer, Howard Ullery, Mr. Madary, C. D. Rex and Max Mutzel, after which the second scene of the first act will be given by Mrs. Klausmeyer, Mr. Madary and Mr. Mutzel.

During the short business session which will precede the entertainment the nominating committee which includes P. D. Pointer chairman, Mrs. Russell Stapp and P. G. Stahly, will present its selections for the offices of president and second vice-president and for five directors, who will be voted upon by the council. In the absence of Frank Clarke, president, Mrs. Harris, first vice-president, will preside. Other officers of the association are Mrs. Clement Smoger, second vice-president, and C. W. Copp, treasurer. Chairman of the standing committees are Mr. Robertson, finance; Mrs. Russell Stapp, extension; Mr. Copp, camp, and Mrs. C. S. Bullock, training.
