

TANNADOONAH GETS NEW CABIN

Exchange Club Busy Today Building Addition.

Camp Tannadoonah, the Camp Fire Girls' reservation on Birch lake, near Vandalia, Mich., will hum with activity today as members of the Exchange club, Camp Fire's sponsoring organization, will gather there to erect a new cabin.
