MAXHAM RITES WILL BE FRIDAY AT WEST POINT

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m., Friday in the Methodist Episcopal church of West Point, Ind., for Donald Evans Maxham, aged 36, of 720 West Grove street, who was found dead from carbon monoxide gas poisoning Wednesday morning in his automobile, parked in his garage.
