DEAR CAMP FIRE FAMILY,

As we conclude our 2023 season, we want to share with you a few of the accomplishments our board and staff are proud of from the past year.

Both of our Before and After School programs completed successful years and are off to a great start for the 2023-2024 school year. We had an excellent group of staff at both programs, and are excited that several of them have returned this year.

The Extended Day program at Good Shepherd Montessori had 65 registered students, and served an average of 18 students each day after school. At the start of the 2023-2024 school year, we have been serving an average of 25 students each afternoon. The Before and After School program at Sam Adams Elementary had 54 registered students last year, and served an average of 29 students each morning before school, and 13 students each afternoon after school. At the start of the 2023-2024 school year, we have 54 registered students, and serve and average of 32 students each morning and 9 each afternoon.

Our summer camp program at Camp Tannadoonah served a total 1197 campers in the summer of 2023! We had a strong and consistent staff this summer, and hope that many of them will return for the summer of 2024.

This year we celebrated a special tradition called the Patteran. The Patteran is a time capsule that we dig up every five years. The campers and staff sing special Patteran songs, and go on a search for the time capsule. Once it is found, we read stories from the past that are inside, and add our own stories for future campers to read.

We continued to look for ways to support our programs through alternative sources of revenue, and received grants from the Margaret A Cargill Philanthropies to support facilities improvements, staff salaries, and projects to increase camper safety. Generous contributions from the Kiwanis Club of South Bend, United Way of Southwest Michigan, United Way of St. Joseph County, and numerous individuals allowed us to provide many scholarships for youth to attend Camp and After School.

We hosted our second AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps (NCCC) team at camp this fall. This year we shared our team with the Cass County Parks Department. They served three weeks at Dr. Lawless Park, and four weeks at Camp Tannadoonah. The seven-member NCCC team helped clear trails and campsites and complete many projects around camp. We were very grateful for all they helped us accomplish!

In September, we held our third-annual grownup camp weekend, and were thrilled to have a beautiful weekend with

approximately 50 people in attendance. Participants enjoyed late night singing around the campfire, traditional camp activities, pontoon cruises on the lake, and amazing weather all weekend long!

Susanne Klein and Tricia Stitz will be concluding their terms on the Board of Directors in December 2023. Susanne and Tricia both joined the board in December 2020, and served as cochairs of the Alumni Committee, helping with alumni outreach and planning of the Grown Up Camp events for the past three years. We are very grateful for Susanne and Tricia's years of dedication to Camp Fire and Camp Tannadoonah!

Our current Chair, John Michel, will also conclude his term as Chair at our meeting in December. John stepped into the Chair role last year for a one-year term, and we are thankful for his leadership over the past year.

Our biggest project of this year the incredible transformation of the waterfront. We replaced the crumbling concrete seawall with a more environmentally friendly rock wall and built a new boat shed for storage of our waterfront equipment. We also built a new pole barn for maintenance and storage, purchased new stalls to improve privacy in the shower house, and purchased a utility vehicle . We made many other improvements - big and small - all around camp.

Thank you to all of our donors, volunteers, and staff members for your generosity and steadfast support in making all this possible, and for your shared passion for helping our Camp Fire youth find their Sparks.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Financial information presented here is based on the unaudited financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2023. The complete financial statements have been determined to represent fairly, in all material aspects, the financial position of Camp Fire River Bend as of September 30, 2023, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

For regular income and expense, the program-related functional expenses represented 81% of the fiscal year expenses, while the expenses for fundraising, online store, and administration represented just 19% of the fiscal year expenses. The council spent \$182,147 on facilities improvement projects and program equipment upgrades, including a new stalls for the shower house, a new pole barn for maintenance, a utility vehicle, a new boat shed, and a new sea wall and landscaping at the waterfront.

Our before and after school programs served a total of 119 youth over the course of the school year, and Camp Tannadoonah served 1197 campers this summer, and celebrated a special tradition called the Patteran.
